



#### Osman Yousefzada, The Go-Between: A Portrait of Growing Up Between Different Worlds

Set in Birmingham in the '80s and '90s, *The Go-Between* opens a window on a devout, patriarchal Pakistani community in the centre of the city's red-light district. By turns humorous, melancholy and harrowing, this account of competing models of masculinity, female erasure and friendship takes us from Birmingham to Pakistan and back to the London of Osman's teenage years. #### THE WINNERS

Katherine Rundell is a Fellow of All Souls College, Oxford. Her bestselling books for children, including *Rooftoppers*, *The Explorer* and, most recently, *The Golden Mole*, have been translated into more than thirty languages and have won multiple awards. Rundell is also the author of a book for adults, *Why You Should Read Children's Books, Even Though You Are So Old and Wise*, and has written for the *London Review of Books*, the *Times Literary Supplement* and the *New York Times*.

Artist and writer **Osman Yousefzada** studied at SOAS and Central Saint Martins, and has an MPhil from Cambridge University. He has been showcased at the Whitechapel Gallery and the V&A among others and made clothes for Beyoncé, Lady Gaga, Lupita Nyong'o, and many more. He edits *The Collective*, has written for *Vogue*, the *Guardian* and *Observer*, and is currently a research practitioner at the Royal College of Art and visiting fellow at Jesus College, Cambridge.

This is the ninth year of the literary quarterly and independent publisher Slightly Foxed's sponsorship of the Biographers' Club Slightly Foxed Best First Biography Prize, with a winner's award of £2,500.
